Missions Notes:

- Indonesia—This past month Kent had the opportunity to fly in support of education for a few of the villages in the mountains of Papua. Several places we serve have primary schools, but the students need to travel to the big city to continue their studies. It's quite a leap of faith for parents to send their kids away, but they clearly believe in the investment they are making. One of the best things about MAF is that we have seen a trajectory towards positive changes, including a change in the model that helps in our quest to become the "all around" pilot: flying precisely, making careful decisions, communicating well, and being a team player. Over the past few months we've been tackling the book of Romans with our boys. Chapter 12 lays out a list of characteristics of a follower of Jesus. Not unlike our model for pilots, this chapter contains a wide spectrum of habits, traits, and challenges for growth. Please pray for Kent as he continues to build relationships, and for Amy as she homeschools the boys this year.
- Turkey— There is a small church that met about 20 minutes away from us. We attended only occasionally due to the language barrier and a wish to avoid the label of "church people" because of all the baggage that comes with that title. A few weeks ago that church moved to our town and the leaders invited us to be more involved. In the past two years we have grown our language skills and established ourselves as normal people who also happen to be followers of Jesus, and are confident in our decision to attend regularly and help out as we can. Of the 85 million people living in Turkey, only about 10,000 are Christians, most of which gather in groups of 15 or less. We have been praying for the Lord to send laborers into this land, and part of His answer may include a team from Minneapolis made up of three families and two single ladies that have been praying and thinking about coming to join us. Please pray for these individuals as they seek the will of God. We are settled into our new house and have had many opportunities to have "God conversations" recently. Please continue to pray for the people of Avanos and the surrounding area to have open hearts, and wisdom for us as we see some transition in Rhine's job and the organization for which he works.
- Mexico—At the altar call during one of our worship services many people came forward to dedicate their lives to Jesus. It was a wonderful response to the Word of God. I closed the service with this statement—"The purpose of this life is not to protect your life, but to live free, live with a purpose, live bravely, and live with dignity, humility, and sacrifice for the glory of His Name." Even after the service many people came forward to speak with us and express appreciation for the message. I want to express my deep appreciation for each of you, the faithful, who sacrificially give so others may be challenged and changed.


