### Missions Notes:

- ◇ Indonesia—Our team supports several communities with no road access, each differing in size, development, and church ministry. One place I often go is Nipsan, about a 30-minute flight from Wamena over incredibly rough terrain. A pioneering Dutch missionary reached out to the people of Nipsan around 50 years ago and some of the evangelists he brought were brutally killed by the locals. There are still struggles and a very tangible darkness in the valley. Just a week ago I had the chance to fly out a young boy who had suffered burns, and again today had a call to pick up a young woman from a neighboring community who had been injured in a landslide. Please pray with us for the people of these remote villages, that they would come to know Jesus and the light of His love. Please continue to pray for us as we homeschool our boys, and for continued safe operations for our MAF pilots and unity on our team.
- ◇ Turkey— On the 2nd of September, Thalia and Lyla had their first day of school. They have never attended an ordinary school so all of this is new to them, including the language. This is a standard state run Turkish school, so the only English that they hear during the day is during English class. Although they don't understand much Turkish yet, we anticipate a quick pick up for them. It's hard to make friends when you can't communicate, so if they learn nothing else this year other than Turkish and how to make Turkish friends we will count it as a success. Bethany International has been a part of our lives since 2002; although we like things to stay the same, they never do. Bethany has been headquartered just south of Minneapolis for the past 70 years, and recently has been given the opportunity to sell that property. Bethany is letting go of many of the things of the past and leaning into the new thing that the Lord is doing. We don't know exactly what it will look like but we believe that Bethany has enormous potential to make Kingdom impact in this world. Part of this new chapter of Bethany means another round of restructuring, and that restructuring means that Rhine will be stepping out of his role as Vice President for Field Leadership. He very much enjoyed his time serving Bethany in this way, and it's not without sadness that this chapter closes for him. Continue to pray for and with us as we seek the Lord's leading for our future.
